Bullying


- A repeated act intended to intimidate, humiliate or ridicule
- Methods: Physical, emotional and relational
- Exploits an imbalance of power
- The bully, the bullied and the bystander

Cyberbullying

- Bullying through the use of technology
- Often anonymous with no accountability
- Methods expand with every new device/app
- Texting, social media, websites, blogs, surveys, impersonation, Instagram, Twitter, Snapchat

- The SECOND leading cause of death for ages 10-24
- Up 57.4% for ages 10-24 from 2007 to 2018
- Tripled for ages 10-14 from 2007 to 2017
